

Bringing STEAM to Life with Our Community Partners

One of the most anticipated events of the season is here—**April STEAM Week!** Beginning April 22, BTGB high school students from Cambridge, Boston, and Somerville are stepping out of the classroom and into a dynamic, hands-on learning experience. Through immersive field trips and interactive activities, students are discovering the wide world of careers in science, engineering, digital technology, and beyond.

From touring advanced labs to collaborating with tech professionals in small groups, our students are gaining a behind-the-scenes look at today's most innovative industries. They're strengthening their science and math skills through guided challenges that mirror real-world scenarios. This year, students explored groundbreaking cancer treatments tailored to individual patients using the body's immune system—examining tumor cells under a five-headed microscope and conducting experiments with a benchtop centrifuge.

Throughout the week, students are visiting top biotech companies and leading research centers across Greater Boston, including the **Koch Institute** for Integrative Cancer Research at **MIT**. At the Community Exploration and Learning Lab (CELL), **Novartis** scientists are offering hands-on biomedical lab experiences and mentoring students on their educational and career journeys.

The week also includes visits to **Google's** offices and exhibitions at the **MIT Museum** and the **Institute of Contemporary Art**, where students explore the intersection of technology, creativity, and innovation. This action-packed week of talks, tours, and exploration is designed to ignite curiosity, deepen academic engagement, and inspire Breakthrough students to envision themselves as future leaders in STEAM fields.

Since our very first Summer Program more than 30 years ago, Breakthrough Greater Boston has remained steadfast in its mission to expand equitable educational access and close the


threat, as baseless attacks on equity initiatives are being used to justify alarming cuts to federal education funding and the dismantling of key partners like AmeriCorps that help make our programs possible.

Expert research confirms the crucial impact on student success that a diverse staff of well-trained educators can have for students of color, those from immigrant families, and other underserved populations. Students perform better and aim higher when they learn from teachers with shared experiences. Furthermore, training a diverse teaching force addresses a stark need felt across Massachusetts and nationally. To this end, BTGB intentionally recruits teacher trainees who reflect the incredibly diverse backgrounds of our students. In the wake of several local detentions of international students by federal ICE agents and the seeming suspension of due process, BTGB joins the Greater Boston community in fearing for the safety of our program participants, especially our immigrant students and Teaching Fellows.
